In effect each winter season, from November 15th to April 1st, regardless of the weather.

Vehicles parked between the hours of 12am and 7am on Town streets, in Town parking lots, or in any manner that interferes with winter maintenance, may be ticketed or towed.

Who plows what?

Town of Midland

- Assumed Town roads, sidewalks and municipal parking lots.
- That's 270 kms of roads and 130 kms of sidewalks!

County of Simcoe

- County roads including; Balm Beach Road and County Road 93.

Ministry of Transportation

- A portion of County Road 93 and Highway 12.

Waste Bin Placement

County of Simcoe picks up the solid waste bins.

- Place bin on a cleared driveway, up to 8ft from the road edge.
- Do not place bins on Town streets or Town sidewalks as it interferes with plowing.

Resident's Duty for Safety

What can you do to help?

- Be patient.
- Stay a safe distance away - plows are big!
- Do not push snow onto the roadway or across the street.
- Follow winter parking restrictions.



Winter Operations in Midland

○ What order are roads plowed in?

We follow the province's Minimum Maintenance Standards (MMS) which puts **priority roads** first to maintain public safety. After priority routes are clear, crews begin the **secondary roads**.

- **Priority Roads** include emergency routes, school zones and business areas.
- **Secondary roads** include residential and rural roads.

○ Can I use parks and trails during the Winter?

During winter all trails, playgrounds, sports fields and courts are **closed**. This is to keep our residents and visitors safe, as well as ensure the longevity of recreational spaces.

○ Significant Weather Events - What happens?

A **Significant Weather Event** may be declared when current or forecasted conditions pose a serious risk to users of roads and sidewalks. While snow is falling, the roads and sidewalks will never be completely clear and crews continue to work around the clock. Remember, a significant weather event is **not** a declaration of an emergency. Stay informed by subscribing to midland.ca/subscribe.

○ Where's my plow?

○ What can I do if I have concerns?
